85th ICAR Foundation Day



New Delhi, 16 July 2013. Hon'ble President of India, Shri Pranab Mukherjee, delivered Foundation Day Lecture on 85th ICAR Foundation Day, held at A.P. Shinde Auditorium, NASC Complex. He said, "In our economy, agriculture retains its primary importance in value creation and employment generation. There are millions of

farmers tilling on small- and-marginal holdings. Our challenge is to reach out to the last farmland and equip them with the best cultivation methods". He recalled the era of 'ship-to-mouth existence' before Green Revolution, and added that now India is a leading producer of essential food commodities like wheat, rice, fresh fruits, vegetables, milk, eggs and fish. It has transformed from being a food-deficient to food surplus country and an exporter of agricultural produce. He added, "I compliment the agricultural research and development system of our country for their untiring efforts". Hon'ble President of India launched 'Kissan SMS Portal', created by the Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Government of India. The portal is capable of sending messages in regional languages on preferred crop and activity giving information and advisories.



Shri Sharad Pawar, Union Minister for Agriculture and Food Processing Industries and President, ICAR Society, presented new publications, 'Climate Change and Sustainable Food Security' in English and 'Aadhunik Phal Utpadan' in Hindi to Hon'ble President of India who earlier released these titles.

Shri Sharad Pawar emphasized upon various challenges before Indian Agriculture. These challenges call for a paradigm shift in our research approach to harness the potential of modern science, encourage innovations in technology generation, and investment environment. While complimenting ICAR Institutions for taking several worthy

initiatives, he advised, "of course the real test of ICAR lies in the farmers' field. If farmer is able to produce more with less input

and earn better, I will consider ICAR's interventions are successful". Shri Ashish Bahuguna (Secretary, Department of Agriculture and Cooperation, Ministry of Agriculture) presented a brief on 'Kissan SMS Portal'.

Dr S. Ayyappan (Secretary, DARE and DG, ICAR) presented glimpses of ICAR achievements and the way forward.
