Weather was almost dry with a gradual increase in the temperature. The flue-cured tobacco crop during this season has picked-up good growth initially, but due to drought weather after planting there was a set back in subsquent growth, thereby the yields were low to moderate. Due to competition in the trade circles, the flue-cured tobacco leaf was purchased briskly and the cultivators received satisfactory prices for their produce.

RESEARCH HIGH LIGHTS & MAJOR EVENTS:

CTRI Research Station, Guntur (A. P.):

During the early part of the quarter, heavy incidence of caterpiller attack Was noticed in farmers fields of FCV

tobacco in Krishna and Guntur districts. This unusal outbreak was controlled by resorting to integrated approach of pest control management i. e. timely spray of NPV and fixing up of sex pheromone traps as advised by the scientists of our Institute Farmers were impressed by these methods and they appreciated the timely action taken by our scientists jointly with Tobacco Board Officials.

CTRI Research Station, Vedasandur (Tamil Nadu):

Farmers appreciated the performance of the new promising cigar filler line HV, 75-10, which is being tried in the farmers' fields in cigar filler tract of Tamil Nadu.

CTRI Research Station, Hunsur (Karnataka):


In a group of six promising FCV tobacco lines compared in final evaluation, lines NFML-2 and 2399 were significantly superior to the rest, yielding 2239 and 1833 Kg/ha. of total cured leaf respectively; corresponding bright leaf recovery was 1903 and 1422 Kg/ha.

(a) Demonstrations on the Neem Oil Emulsion Control Suckers of FCV Tobacco in Konthamuru Village:


Under Operational Research Project (ORP) the Neem

Oil Emulsion was applied in the two acre field of Shri Cherukuri Subba Rao, a progressive farmer of Konthamuru Village. The participant farmer expressed that the application of Neem Oil Emulsion is cheap, effective in controlling suckers and can be applied easily.

(b) Demonstration with leaf extracts of Basella and Bougainvillaea against the TMV resistance:

In the field of Shri Gadda Suryarao, a literate and leading farmer of Konthamuru village, the leaf extracts

were sprayed at the top portions of the individual plants. under the technical guidance of Shri N. S. Murty, Scientist S-1 (Plant Pathology) of this Institute. The farmers from Konthamuru village were brought to the place of demonstration and were taught the method.

Field Day was celebrated during the 3rd week of February, 1982 at Lingayapalam, Ankireddipalem, Lalpuram





CTRI Research Station Vedasandur, (Tamil Nadu):

Four centres were planted under the rotational trial Ragi in Khariff and Tobacco in Rabi and seven centres

were planted with a trial on foliar spray of urea. Crop was normal in all the centres and the benefit of new technology has been clearly demonstrated to the farmers of the area.
