The paper explains how social fencing or social protection system of Sukhomajri village near Chandigarh emerged and how cyclic development model is born. It shows systematically the whole of the practical philosophy of social fencing in which slowly but steadily a never ending cycle of social fund and social employment emerged to make social protection system stronger and stronger. It also narrates the relevance of social fencing by the landless of Harijan-Nada (Haryana) who built up an eye opener cycle of annual social fund of Rs. 21 and annual social employment of about Rs. 200 just from one quintal of perennial bhabar grass raised in the hills. Investment of just 200 mandays generated annual employment of 1000 mandays and also about Rs. 1000 annual social fund for annual ploughing back to build up land and water bank for annual flow of employment and social fund increasing in cyclic order year after year
