The paper gives an account of traditional agroforestry systems practised in Western and Eastern Ghats in general and Nilgiri hill region in particular. The practices with regard to taungya and energy plantations, home gardens, border planting, multi-tier cropping system, plantations with terraced hill farming, irrigated agroforestry, intercropping with medicinal plants/oilseed trees, wind breakers, etc. have been discussed. For Nilgiri region, bluegum (*Eucalyptus globulus*) based agroforestry systems are discussed with the support of research data.
