From the Director's Desk



Global tobacco scenario

The world FCV tobacco production in 2011 is expected to increase by 2.35% to 4,655 M kg compared to 4,548 M kg produced in 2010. However, production in African countries has dramatically increased obviously due to more area taken up by the farmers because of the attractive prices realized in 2008 and 2009. Important FCV producing countries such as Zimbabwe, Brazil and Tanzania have produced higher crop with

marginal increase over other countries, except China and India where the crop has declined because of incessant rains.

Total world tobacco leaf production in 2011 is forecasted at 6,475 M kg. Generally, FCV tobacco prices are influenced by the demand and supply situation in the international market. The increase in production in almost all FCV tobacco producing countries leading to excess supply resulting in a "Buyers' Market" and lower prices.

Indian scenario

In Karnataka, a total quantity of 127.85 M kg FCV tobacco was produced from an area of 1,18,652 ha during 2010-11 crop season, as against the authorized quantity of 100 M kg. In KLS, auctions have been

completed by the end of June, 2011 and the average price was ₹ 92.30/kg. In the current crop season of 2011-12, the crop growth is satisfactory likely to give normal yields and quality.

In Andhra Pradesh, FCV tobacco crop was planted in an area of 1,14,000 ha and the production is expected to touch 165 M kg mark as against 170 M kg permitted by the Tobacco Board during 2010-11. The lower production in A.P. is mainly due to unprecedented rains and *Laila* cyclone which affected the crop growth and leaf yields. However, the leaf quality is good with ~80% bright grade out turn.

Tobacco auctions in A.P. have begun, but the prices are not commensurate with the quality and farmers are not happy with the prices offered. By the end of June, 2011, 75 M kg of tobacco is marketed at an average price of ₹ 108.40/kg, while the farmers demand ₹125/kg to sustain the cost of production. At CTRI. Rajahmundry, FCV tobacco seed collection, processing and packing are in progress for distribution to the farmers during 2011-12 crop season.

RESEARCH HIGHLIGHTS

CTRI RS, Hunsur

Paecilomyces lilacinus (20g/ m²) in combination with poultry manure@lkg/m² and lilacinus $(20g/m^2)$ combination with neem cake @1kg/m² were on par with each other in significantly controlling root-knot nematodes on FCV tobacco nursery beds by causing 58.4% and 57.1% reduction in root-knot index, respectively. Subsequent increase in root-knot free and healthy transplants count was to the tune of 58.7 and 55.4%, respectively.

International Collaborative Study on Cigarette Smoking Methods

CTRI has participated in the collaborative study sponsored by the International Organisation for Standardisation (ISO)/Technical Committee (TC) - 126, Berlin, Germany to estimate the main stream smoke yields of nicotine-free dry particulate matter (NFDPM), nicotine and carbon monoxide (CO) from eight commercial cigarette brands and two

reference cigarettes/ monitor test pieces smoked under ISO and Health Canada Intense (HCI) machine smoking regimes. The study was taken up by 35 participating laboratories from 21 countries, including India. The comprehensive report showed that the values reported by CTRI are well in agreement with the overall mean values of all the laboratories.
