Integrated cultivation practices in Maize

Plant Health Clinic

Chief Editor

Examined 60 infested plant samples and advised to the farmers about management practices. Field plots in Hosahalli, Karepura, Doddahejjaji, Peddanahalli, Bommavara, Arasanahalli, Hasiruvalli, K R Pura and Jakkenahalli villages were visited and information was provided to the farmers about integrated pest and disease management practices in different field and horticultural crops.

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
